Welcome to the 2018 Saddles Plus Interschool Equestrian Festival

Thank you to the 130 riders along with 166 horses representing 51 schools that attended the 2017 State Championships, our sponsors, trade village and service providers that support the event that continues to grow. Equestrian WA had almost a full team of riders participate at the Australian Championships in Queensland in September 2017 with many WA riders bringing home personal bests.

Equestrian Western Australia is excited to present the 2018 Saddles Plus Interschool Equestrian Festival, incorporating the Saddles Plus Interschool State Championships and Saddles Plus Participation Competition. The newly introduced Saddles Plus Interschool Equestrian Participation Competition offers grass-roots level Interschool competitors an opportunity to experience the thrill of competing at the Interschool Championships. The aim of the Participation Competition is to offer a better pathway for young competitors into the sport and to provide an opportunity for riders of all levels to participate. We are also excited to host the best junior riders around the state who will compete in dressage, jumping, combined training and show horse aiming to win a state title and opportunity to represent Western Australia at the Australian Interschool Championships to be held in Victoria. Good luck for the future to the 2018 Year 12 riders and we look forward to welcoming our new young riders who are participating for the first time at the State Championships.

This year the event has had a number of changes. Some of these changes include:

- The OC will attempt where possible to present individual sports awards however overall and team jumping awards will be published and awarded the week following the event.
- The newly introduced Saddles Plus Interschool Equestrian Participation Competition offers grass-roots level Interschool competitors an opportunity to experience the thrill of competing at the Interschool Championships. This competition is open to EWA Members with a minimum Participation level EWA Membership. Competitors in the Saddles Plus State Equestrian Interschool Championships are eligible to enter the participation competition in 1 discipline that they have not qualified for and are not competing in in the State Championships. Please see the schedule for further information.
- Stabling will be limited, there will be allocated stables strictly on order of entry. Stables and camping will be booked manually and your forms sent to
 <u>Nerissa.foster@equestrianwa.org.au</u> at EWA. Booking forms to be emailed in by the COB 12 March 2018.
- A plastic pocket will be on each stable that will need to display your stable poster with the relevant details of contact numbers. This is to remain visible at all times.
- Volunteers are crucial to run this event, the same procedure will be activated to pay \$80 at time of entry to eliminate our huge volunteer roster. This money will be refunded once your duty has been finalized. If you are not wanting to volunteer for your duty your fee will be used to subsidize the cost of paid volunteers. **10 days' notice prior to your child's event** must be given if you wish to forfeit your fee. Events simply cannot run without huge resources and so this procedure will be in place. Minimum duty time of 3hrs for parent helpers. Paid Volunteers minimum 4hrs.
- Any changes to entries or volunteers will incur a fee of \$50.00 per change if accepted.
- To compete at this event, riders/teams must sign the team manager form and Riders Profile forms and return to Sara Botten at EWA by COB 12 March 2018
- **Qualification is required** for those competitors in State Championship classes in 2018. Competitors who fail to submit their qualification cards risk exclusion from the event and forfeit of entry fees. See website for more details. <u>www.wa.equestrian.gov.au</u>

GENERAL INFORMATION

This event is to be run under **National Interschool Rules**. Where rules are not stated in the National Interschool Rulebook, please refer to current EA / FEI rules. We strongly recommend that all team managers obtain a copy of the relevant EA rule books through the EWA website.

Athletes competing in the Saddles Plus Interschool Equestrian State Championship Classes must be current Competitor Junior members of EWA and horses must be registered with EA and microchipped. Athletes competing in the Saddles Plus Interschool Equestrian Participation Classes must be a minimum current Participant member.

Athletes competing in the Saddles Plus Interschool Equestrian State Championship must provide a **signed Team Managers slip** with the student's names and school email. Athletes competing in the Saddles Plus Interschool Equestrian Participation Classes must nominate a parent/guardian contact when entering.

Stewards will be on the grounds throughout the event, who have the right to eliminate riders for dangerous riding and misconduct pertaining to the EA codes.

Codes of Conduct for EA Conducted Equestrian Events

Codes of Conduct for Athletes, spectators and volunteers as well as other relevant Codes and Policies relating to the conducting of an equestrian event under EA rules are available on the EA website. At time of entry you will be required to confirm you have read and agree to the Codes of Conduct.

Member and Child Protection Policy

EA Member Protection Policy, Child Protection Policy and other relevant Codes and Policies relating to the conducting of an equestrian event under EWA rules are available on the EWA website.

Reservation of Right

The Organizing Body reserves the right:

- To cancel any class or event
- To divide any class
- To transfer competitors between sections of a class
- To alter the advertised times
 - To refuse any entry, with or without stating the reason

Neither the Organizing Committee of any event to which these rules apply nor Equestrian Australia accepts any liability for any accident, damage, injury, or illness to horses, athletes, ground, spectators or any other person or the property whatsoever.

By entering this event you give your consent to EWA to copy or reproduce images of yourself as EWA may determine, without acknowledgement of yourself and without your entitlement to any remuneration or compensation now or in the future. The images may be used by EWA in multimedia productions, publications, brochures and on the website to promote a range of initiatives for EWA. EWA agrees not to use any image that may be deemed adverse, or defamatory to the person entering this event.





Age of Competitors

Primary competition is restricted to athletes enrolled up to and including year/grade 6 in the year of competition.

Intermediate competition is defined as those athletes enrolled in years 7, 8 and 9. **Secondary** competition is for those athletes enrolled in year 7 to 12 inclusive in the year of competition, up to 18 years of age in the year of competition.

Students over 18 years of age, and who are members of EA, and who are full time high school students, may apply for special consideration to be allowed to compete.

Age of Horses

All horses and ponies must **be four years of age or older** to compete in Interschool competitions. Horses' ages are assessed from 1 August of the year of birth. Stallions are not permitted. **Only nominated horses** are allowed on the grounds on the day of competition. Only the rider competing on the nominated horse may ride from the time of arrival at the State Equestrian Centre and during the competition.

Number of Horses per Athlete

Athletes may compete with more than one horse (maximum of 2 horses per athlete allowed at ISWA Championship Classes and 3 horses per athlete for Participation Competition) and in multiple disciplines, as long as the National Discipline Rules are followed regarding the number of tests/classes that may be contested per day. Athletes may compete with multiple horses in the same class should they choose to. Where an athlete competes on more than one horse in a discipline only **one of the Athletes scores may count towards the team score**. eg an athlete cannot be in a team with 2 horses.

Number of Classes you may enter

Athletes entering classes MUST bear in mind the welfare of the rider, horse and the relevant EA rules for the discipline relating to number of starts per day. Athletes are only allowed to enter **2 consecutive dressage levels** on the same horse. i.e. Prelim/Novice or Novice/Elem. Riders in Showjumping may only **enter two consecutive height class's per horse**. Show horse riders must choose to compete in one section, show horse, show hunter or working hunter. Combined Training riders may only compete in one class per combination. Competitors in the Saddles Plus State Equestrian Interschools are eligible to enter the participation competition in **1 discipline** that they have **not qualified** for and are not competing in in the State Championships eg. State Championship Elementary/Medium Dressage and Participation 60cm and 70cm Participation Jumping. Please note every effort will be made to avoid clashing of classes but Championship Classes will take precedent over Participation Classes. Again, athletes are asked to consider welfare of the horse when entering multiple classes.

Gear Check

Gear check is the responsibility of the Team Manager, however EA Stewards this year will also conduct checks. Discipline rules can be found on the EWA or EA website. Judges have the right to eliminate a rider if they compete in the incorrect gear.

Soundness

The judges are required to satisfy themselves regarding the soundness of all horses, and therefore have the authority to stop an unsound horse from competing prior to or during the competition.





Entries

2018 ENTRIES WILL ONLY BE ACCEPTED ON-LINE VIA NOMINATE at <u>www.nominate.com.au</u> Entries close 12th March 2018 no late entries will be accepted. Please make sure you have sent in your qualifying card when entering for the State Interschool Championships. Athletes that enter without having completed their qualifying requirements will have their entries returned less \$47.50 administration fee.

Breed Awards

To be eligible for High Point Breed Awards riders are required to submit breed registration information on entry. Further information on Awards available will be published on the Equestrian Western Australia Interschools Equestrian Festival website http://www.wa.equestrian.org.au/interschool/2018-interschool-festival

Fees

Administration Fee - \$47.50 per Horse/Athlete Combination

(This fee covers the cost of extra arena hire, equipment hire, SEC Facility Fee, and extra infrastructure that is required for the event.)

Helper Bond - \$80 per Athlete/Horse Combination (This fee will be refundable once your duty is performed of a minimum of 3 hours. If a helper does not wish to perform a voluntary job, this fee will allow us to employ appropriate people to fill the roles)

Teams Chosen for the Australian Championships

All place getters in Dressage and Showjumping classes for each of the Australian Championships qualifying events (these are marked in the schedule) are eligible to represent WA at the Australian Championships to be held in Victoria 2018. Selection based upon results from the last twelve months, as reviewed by OC from the Interschool Series. At the Australian Championships athletes will be limited to competing in 2 classes, they may still compete on 2 horses, but the limitation of 2 classes per athlete will remain.

In Show Horse and Combined Training, place getters 1st to 4th in Australian Championships qualifying events will be eligible to represent WA. In the event of the first -fourth place getters being unable to attend the Australian Interschool Equestrian Championships in 2018, the remaining places will be filled at the discretion of the OC.





Changes to submitted Entries

After close of entries on the 12th March 2018, NO CLASS ENTRIES will be changed. Horses/ponies may be substituted to the same classes you have already entered with submission of a current Vet Certificate. Changes will only be accepted 48 hours prior to the event and will be at the discretion of the OC. A \$50.00 penalty fee will be applied to all changes IF approved. Substituted horses must have qualified for the same events that the withdrawn horse was entered into. NO CLASS OTHER CHANGES WILL BE MADE UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.

Objections & Disputes

Objections must be made to the OC within thirty minutes of the official posting of the class results giving rise to the objection through your team manager. A formal protest requires a deposit of \$100 that will be forfeited unless the objection is upheld. The decision of the OC/ground jury will be final and no further discussions will be entered into. All objections must be made through team managers to the OC, no objections will be submitted other than from the Team Managers.

Refund Policy

Entry fees will not be refunded after the close of entries unless on submitted medical and/or veterinary certificates and will be at the sole discretion of the OC. A fee of \$47.50 will be held for administration. In the event of cancellation of the competition or part thereof due to any circumstance beyond the control of the Interschool working group entry fees will be refunded less \$47.50 to help defray administration costs. Stable booking changes will be refunded until COB 16 April 2018.

Helpers & Team Managers

Team Managers are responsible for ensuring that nominated helpers report for their duties. **Team Managers are not to nominate as Volunteers unless their school is not riding that day**. In the case that there is only one rider from a school and the team Manager is the parent of the sole rider, then it is their responsibility to supply a volunteer to complete their helper duty. A Volunteer can be a nominated person from 16yrs and upwards. **Riders in participation classes are also expected to provide a helper**.

At the Saddles Plus Interschool Equestrian Festival, volunteers will include numerous parents and other supporters who become de-facto EA "Officials". Abuse by a rider, parent or associated person that is aimed at any official at any EWA / INTERSCHOOL event will not be tolerated. Incidents of this nature will result in immediate elimination of the rider. Many of our helpers are experienced; others are not. Be sure to ask for assistance if you are unsure of what to do. To keep the event on time, it is crucial for helpers to report for their allocated duties to the "Volunteer's Tent" 15 minutes before their scheduled duty begins. High Vis Vest are to be worn. **Helpers who do not perform their designated duty will eliminate the rider they are assigned to help**. It is your responsibility to notify the helper coordinator and find a replacement if you are unable to fulfil your allocated duty. We would be grateful if you could please advise whether any helper or volunteer is a vet or doctor.

Team managers are the team's port of call for contact. All competitors that have queries or disputes must report to your team manager only. Please do not contact the OC directly.

Volunteer Roster

There will be a volunteer roster posted on Nominate following closure of entries. At the event there will be a volunteer tent that you report to 15mins before your allocated time of duty to sign in and pick up your High Vis vest, then after completion of your duty to report back to the tent to sign off, to enable your refund to be processed back onto your credit card. If forfeiting your helper fee this will be paid to an organized volunteer.





Stables/Yards

Stable bookings will be allocated based on the School blocks as so many competitors, space is at a premium. Stables MUST be booked via the Stable Booking Form downloaded from the Interschool Equestrian Festival website http://www.wa.equestrian.org.au/interschool/2018-interschool form the Interschool and returned to State Equestrian Centre Facility & Bookings Coordinator Nerissa Foster prior to 12 March 2018.

Stable allocation lists are posted at the swab box and handbook. Hay will be allowed in bags or nets. Manure and wet bedding must be placed in the Manure bunkers at the end of each aisles of A, H & N and stables are expected to be cleaned by 8.00am each morning. At a random time each day, ISWA & SEC Staff will check stables and aisles. **Stable Posters** must be completed and attached to the front of the stable for the duration of the event.

Arrival Times

Stables will be available after 3:00pm 17th April 2018. Stables are not available prior to this date. If you wish to arrive earlier please use yards.

Additional Yards

"Stabling and yards should be of solid construction. From 01 January 2011, the use of electrified tape, strings, ropes or chains, will not be permitted at EA Events."

Additional yards are available on the polocrosse grounds. The user must assume all risk for their horse, and yards must be left in good order. Floats with yards may be parked throughout the event in designated parking areas on the State Equestrian Centre grounds. These yards must be cleaned of all hay, manure and other rubbish when vacated or competitors will be fined.

For those competitors keeping their horses in the polocrosse yards, manure must be placed in the concrete bunkers provided. Out of courtesy to the State Equestrian Centre, please leave this area tidy.

ABSOLUTLEY NO ROPING OFF OF AREAS PRIOR TO THE EVENT

Parking

Such large numbers means that parking space for cars, floats and trucks will be tight. Trucks and floats are to be parked in the truck parking area as per signage on the grounds. Please be patient, park graciously and with care. Importantly, there will be many small children (and ponies!) that may be difficult to see from trucks and 4-wheel drives, so be extra careful, particularly when backing up. Please be aware that your vehicle display form must be on the dash board of your vehicle with easy access to view details. Vehicle display forms can be downloaded from the Interschool Equestrian Festival website http://www.wa.equestrian.org.au/interschool/2018-interschool-festival

Camping

Camping is available at the State Equestrian Centre free of charge for Equestrian WA Members. Showers and toilets are available at the Centre. Feed supplies can be purchased from Brigadoon Produce located nearby (Phone (08) 9296 1575). Hay must be kept in bags or nets at all times. Alternative accommodation in the Swan Valley may be booked through the Swan Valley Visitor Centre at <u>www.swanvalley.com.au</u>

NO ROPING OFF OF AREAS and there will be no power outlets available at the venue. You will need to supply your own generators for power. No power cords to be left along grassed areas or around horse yards/horses including stable blocks.





Stable Safety & Risk Management

SEC has strict stable safety guidelines and risk management policy which must be adhered to, but please be aware of these important conditions. Visitors are asked to adhere to the following:

As a condition of entry to the SEC, persons:

- 1. Agree to follow the direction and instruction of SEC staff at all times whilst on the grounds
- 2. Agree to adhere to all directions displayed on signage at the SEC
- 3. Agree they will not do any of the following within the SEC:
 - (a) use indecent, obscene, insulting or threatening language
 - (b) behave in an offensive or indecent manner
 - (c) ride a horse without a safety helmet and without appropriate clothing and footwear
 - (d) ride a horse bareback
 - (e) ride a horse that is rugged and/or unbridled
 - (f) light any fire

(g) bring or attempt to bring into the SEC any alcohol or glass without the written approval of the SEC

(h) bringing a dog to the SEC without a lead. Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times and under control whilst at the SEC

(i) take animals into any building at the SEC

(j) leave any personal or animal waste at the SEC, except if that waste is left in the appropriate bins allocated

- (k) use any fire hoses at SEC. Penalties will apply
- (I) interfere with or harm any wildlife at the SEC
- (m) smoke in or around any SEC building. All SEC buildings are smoke free

(n) break, damage, deface, obliterate or cover any structure, machinery, equipment, sign, descriptive plate or label.

Smoke Free Areas (No Smoking) ALL THE TIME

- All buildings (admin building, conference rooms, judge's boxes, event office, machinery shed)
- The stable complex
- Indoor arena
- Event square (Presidents lawn Trade village)
- All arena fields of play

Uniforms

Riders are to wear shirt and tie/stock with school jumper, school vest or school hacking jacket (not school blazer), white or light coloured breeches or jodhpurs and riding boots (full grain gaiters matching boots are permitted). School logo must be worn on either the school jumper, school vest, or school Jacket, along with school logo on saddle cloths.

In the case of hot weather the OC may allow for jumpers and jackets to be removed and shirts underneath must be sleeved. For other attire, refer to EA rules for each discipline.

Gaiters

Athletes may wear gaiters made from full grain leather, either black or brown to match boots. In Show Horse, Show Hunter and Working Hunter Rider Sections, riders under the age of 18 are not permitted to wear gaiters.





Warmup Arena & Arenas

These are designated by discipline and are limited to 8 horses at a time per arena. Please ensure that riders follow the rules and do not create dangerous situations by overloading warm up areas. Riders who disobey this risk elimination. No horses may be worked (ridden or lunged) 30 min after the competition has ended for the day. The SEC cross-country course and polocrosse field are out of bounds. Please note that as per each arena and discipline, riders must compete in draw order. Helmets must be worn while lunging. Lunging may only be conducted in designated round yards.

Rider Numbers

Each Athlete/horse combination will be assigned a competitor number for the event. It is the rider's responsibility to provide their own numbers, which must be worn on the horse both sides at all times when out of their stable/yard. Numbers can be worn on the bridle (both sides), saddle blanket (both sides) or rider's back (Eventing). Please remember, if you are riding two horses, you will need to have the correct number on each horse. If you are walking your horse/s around on a halter your bridle numbers must be worn at all times on both sides at the venue of competition.

Swabbing

The use of prohibited substances in your horse is not tolerated and riders must be aware that swabbing of horses at random will occur.

The team manager (or nominated representative) must accompany individual athletes for swabbing. State Championship competitors must have their horses EA Paperwork with them during the entire event.

Merchandise

Interschool Merchandise will be available for purchase via <u>http://www.equestrianwastore.com/</u> There will be limited merchandise available for purchase during the event but purchases much be completed online for pick up during the event. Merchandise pick up will be available in the Trade Village between 10:00am – 2:00pm each day of the competition.

Working with Children Clearance

It is a legal requirement of all volunteers, working with children, to have their "Working with Children" clearance. If you are a parent of a child competing in the State Event you do not require a clearance. If you are not a parent or teacher and you will be helping, in any way at the 2018 Saddles Plus Equestrian Festival you will require a clearance. Can you please organise this, at your earliest convenience. There is a link on the EWA website to help you.

Rubbish

Bins will be placed around the event. Please use them, taking care not to leave rubbish loose on the ground, particularly plastic bags that can spook horses as well as bottles and cans etc.

Vet, Medical & Farrier Aid

If you need assistance, please ask one of the marshals on the ground who will have a two way radio to contact the organizers. We certainly hope that we won't need the services of these people but, of course, we have to have them on hand, just in case. If any doctors and vets could volunteer to be on duty on one of the days of the Festival it would be a great help. Any costs incurred will be the responsibility of the owner or individual requiring the treatment.

Important Etiquette

Please respect the riders and horses by not yelling, running, or interrupting when they are competing or in the stable and warm-up areas. Spectators must enter the indoor arena quietly or wait until a





competitor is finished, i.e. during jumping rounds or dressage tests. It is particularly important during this very busy weekend to exercise restraint and quiet where possible, since horses are upset by sudden noise and movement and could endanger children on the grounds.

Team Managers Meeting

The first Team managers meeting will be held inside the classroom at the Trade Village area on Tuesday evening at 6:00pm. It is essential that all Team managers attend this meeting for information pertaining to the Festival and any changes made. Team managers will be able to pick up your teams rider bags from here also. There will be a team managers meeting morning at 7.30am in front of the classroom on Thursday and Friday. These meetings provide vital information that is required to give to your team during the day. If you are unable to attend for any reason team managers will need to send another representative in your place to inform the riders of any information given.

Results

Individual score sheets and competition result sheets will be available from the event office approximately 1 hour after the publication of the results.

Event Imagery

The OC reserves the right, to make use of all photographs, images and videos made on behalf of the OC during the event or on the show grounds for their own commercial purposes, without explicit consent of the person/competitor illustrated.

Event Organisation

In exceptional circumstances, with the approval of the Ground Jury and Chief Steward, the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the EWA by the Event Director.

Cancellation of the Event

If special circumstances demand it, the OC reserves the right to take all necessary actions including the cancellation of the event by repaying the entry fee, as per refund policy.

SADDLES PLUS STATE INTERSCHOOL EQUESTRIAN CHAMPIONSHIP INDIVIDUAL AND TEAM AWARDS

<u>Points for individual and team awards are ONLY accrued in championship classes, not participation</u> <u>classes.</u>

Teams

Schools can enter as many riders per class as they wish. The top four riders from each discipline per school division will be taken to make up the team, with the top three scores counting towards the team score, and the fourth score to be used in a tie. Therefore schools will not need to nominate teams. Individuals are still encouraged to compete. School uniform rules apply to individuals as well as teams. Individual riders can qualify for the Australian Championships, as well as be eligible for individual awards.

Individual Rider and School Point's Allocation

In each phase the first placed horse will get 28 points, second will get 27 points, third will get 26 points and so on down to 28th horse receiving 1 point, if there are more than 28 riders in a class they receive 1 point. The total points earned across the three phases will determine the championship placings.

• Classes may be split depending on entry numbers and placings and points awarded within each phase and division, however all divisions will be combined to determine the





championship.

• These points are used to determine special Individual and Team Awards.

Scoring for Individual and Team Awards State Titles will be conducted as per the National Interschool Championship rules. **Individuals** will receive points for in each class. Points are allocated based on 28 for first down to 1. (i.e. 28, 27, 26, 25...1). The points received in each class are totaled to decide the Champion, Reserve Champion individuals and 3rd to 6th place prizes.

CHAMPION TEAMS: When calculating a state team score, the total individual points of the top three individuals within the team are counted. The fourth member's points (if there is a 4 th member) are used only to determine the outcome in the case of a tie.

Please see the Scoring Information Document on the Interschool WA Website for further information on scoring.

Rural Rider and Rural School Awards

To be eligible for the Rural Primary & Secondary Trophies you must attend a country school as classified by the Western Australian Department of Education. To be eligible for the Country Primary & Secondary School Trophies the school must be classified as a country school by the Western Australian Department of Education. Riders **MUST INDICATE ON THEIR ENTRY FORM IF THEY ARE ELIGIBLE** as a rural rider or a rural school. If you do not indicate on your entry form you will not be eligible. For a list of schools classified as country schools by the Western Australian Department of Education.

JUMPING

CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION

- The Jumping competition will be conducted under the FEI Jumping Rules & National Rules for Jumping
- Horses must be 4 years of age or older
- Riders may compete in 2 consecutive heights only.
- Saddlery as per EA National Jumping Rules
- Course inspections are only permitted during designated times in the official riding dress.
- Jumping courses will be open for inspection prior to the start of the competitions and reopened between each class for approximately 15 minutes
 - Riders must ride in the order of the draw and must not hold up proceedings on the day,
 - exemptions will be allowed if clashes with Dressage Classes, as these are priority. Course plans will be posted at the entry gate
- Competitors may choose to compete in State Championship Classes or Participation classes in jumping but NOT both.
- Competitors in the Saddles Plus State Equestrian Interschools State Championships are eligible to enter the participation competition in **1 discipline** that they have **not qualified** for and are not competing in in the State Championships

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR JUMPING WARM UP ARENAS

- 1) Respect must be shown to all officials and fellow competitors at all times.
- 2) Follow instructions from the Ring Marshal at all times. Remember: Abuse of officials is a reportable offence.
- 3) Always consult the ring Marshal before entering the warm up arena





- 4) Inform the Office and Ring Marshal if you are scratching.
- 5) Inform the office and Ring Marshal if there is a rider change.
- 6) If there is any reason rider wants to change draw order, this must immediately be forward onto Marshal and Judge for approval.
- 7) Follow the published starting order.
- Abide by the show's recommended number of competitors in the warm up arena at any one time. For classes up to 1.30m there is a maximum of 10 competitors. For all classes above 1.30m there is no restriction
- 9) Only competitors involved in the current competition can use the warm up arena.
- 10) Replace all rails you knock down in the warm up arena
- 11) Warm up fences cannot be set more than 10cm higher and wider than the maximum dimensions of the current class
- 12) Competitors to place warm up fences back to original height when finished
- 13) The nearest horse to go on course has priority to use ONE warm up fence
- 14) Do not return to the warm up fence after completing your round or have been eliminated.
- 15) Do not dismount and hold your horse in the warm up arena unless you are adjusting riding equipment/tack. In this case you must be clear of any jumps

Riders may enter a maximum of 2 consecutive heights per horse

JUMPING CLASSES – Explanation Article 274.5.6 (Super Two Phase)

This competition comprises two phases run without interruption, each at an identical or different speed, the finishing line for the first phase being identical with the starting line for the second phase. The first phase is a course of 5 - 7 obstacles with or without combinations not against the clock. The second phase takes place against the clock over remaining obstacles minimum 11 maximum 13 total for both phases. Placing according to the aggregate penalties in both phases.

Article 274.5.3 (Two Phase)

This competition comprises two phases run without interruption, each at an identical or different speed, the finishing line for the first phase being identical with the starting line for the second phase. The first phase is a course of 7 to 9 obstacles with or without combinations (Table A Against the clock). The second phase takes place over 4 to 6 obstacles, which may include one combination. (Table A Against the clock).

Athletes penalized in the first phase are halted by ringing the bell after they have jumped the last obstacle or when the time allowed for the first phase has been exceeded, after crossing the finishing line of the first phase. They must stop after crossing the first finishing line.

Placing is according to the penalties and time in the second phase and, if necessary, to the penalties and time in the first phase.

Athletes stopped after the first phase may only be placed after athletes who have taken part in both phases. In the event of equality for first place, the tied athletes will be placed equal first.

Article 238.2.2

This is a competition not against the clock, but in the event of equality of penalties for first place, there will be one jump-off against the clock. Other athletes are placed according to their penalties and time in the first round. All Riders who Jump Clear in the first round will be invited back to complete the second round at a raised height (approx. 5cm).

Article 238.2.1 (Optimum Time)

Optimum time competition is a one round competition run under Table A. The distance and the time on course is calculated by the course designer and not to be advertised. Normal time limits apply. The winner is the rider with the leaser number of penalties closest (either over or under) to the time allowed. Riders are not allowed to carry any form of time keeping equipment.





DRESSAGE

CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION

- All horses must be 4 years of age or older
- Gloves are compulsory, and preferably white
- Test to be ridden from memory. No callers allowed
- Starting order will be according to a random draw
- All Dressage tests will be run in accordance with Current EA Rules in the EA Dressage Competition Rules, which can be obtained from the EA website
- Whips are permitted (not exceeding 1.2m including tassel for horses and 1.0m for ponies)
- Whips are not allowed in FEI classes
- Horses may not compete below their graded level (if an official dressage grading applies). However horses graded FEI are permitted to compete Advanced if no FEI classes are offered.
- Spurs can be used at all levels
- Competitors may choose to compete in State Championship Classes or Participation classes in dressage but NOT both.
- Competitors in the Saddles Plus State Equestrian Interschools Championships are eligible to enter the participation competition in 1 discipline that they have not qualified for and are not competing in in the State Championships

CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION

- All horses must be 4 years of age or older
- Age of Riders: as per National IS rules and specific Equestrian Australia Sport rules for Primary School
- Riders competing in Combined Training classes are not eligible to compete in Eventing classes.
- Dressage Test to be ridden from memory. No Callers allowed.
- Dress and Saddlery: According to EA National Eventing Rules
- Scoring Method: According to EA Eventing Rule Annex I
- Starting order by random draw for dressage and jumping will be in reverse order of placings after the dressage
- Course Specifications as per EA National Eventing Rules
- Bridle or saddle blanket number compulsory for dressage and jumping

SCORING

Scoring Method: According to EA Eventing Rules

As combined training runs under Eventing rules, riders are placed based on the number of penalties





they incur over the 2 phases. This means that the rider with the least penalties when penalties from the dressage and jumping phases are added will be the winner. The result is always rounded to one decimal point. Jumping penalties are calculated in the normal manner as per Eventing Jumping Rules. 1 penalty per second over time.

In the case of equal scores for placings in a class the rider with the best dressage score (least penalties) will be the higher placed. If equality still exists, the closest to the optimum time (under the time set) in the jumping element will be the higher placed. If there is still a tie, then the placings will be shared and the subsequent place not awarded. For example, if there is a tie for second place then no third place will be awarded and the points for second and third will be added together and then divided equally between the two tied riders.

SHOW HORSE

CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION

- Judged under EA National 2018 Show Horse Rules effective 1 January 2018 in conjunction with the Interschool Show Horse Rules 2017
- Judging and scoring as per EA National Interschool Show Horse Rules
- Riders must complete all three phases in the class on the same horse.
- Each class will have a timed draw and all riders will complete an individual workout.
- The Championship (total points earned over all phases) will determine the overall ranking of riders, the top 2 riders in each class qualify for the Australian Championships.
- Ribbons will be awarded for Led, Rider and Ridden classes and Championship (combined score across phases)
- Rider and horse/pony combination may compete in <u>one class only</u>, must choose between Show Horse, Show Hunter or Working Hunter.

(Capel will have a levy of \$15 on top of entry fees to cover administration, presentations and ribbons for the State Interschool Championship presentations.)

Primary/Secondary riders that are eligible to compete in eventing classes cannot also compete in Combined Training at the State Interschool Championships.

- Competitors <u>must</u> mark on their entry form for the event that they are participating as an Interschool Competitor within their class AND submit their qualification card to Equestrian Western Australia by the 6 March 2018 to be accepted into State Championship classes.
- Riders must be current financial Equestrian Australia members & membership number must be included with entry together with name of school & school year
- All Interschools State Championship riders need to be competitor junior members and have their horse registered & microchipped for this event
- Interschool riders may have multiple rides in different classes (One Interschool horse per class) but only the best placing result will count towards Interschool points.
- Competitors can compete as an Interschool competitor from EvA80 level 1 through to the CNC*. (EvA65 level is not an Interschool Championship class or qualifier for Australian championships).





- Interschool riders ride within their chosen class, so if Interschool rider "A" in the Junior EvA105 class finishes 3rd in the class, but is the highest placed Interschool rider they will receive the 3rd place prize from Capel as well as 1st place prize from Interschool WA.
- Interschool ribbons will be awarded to the 1st 6th (Points will be awarded as per 2018 Interschool's schedule), however there will be no presentations made at Capel for Interschool riders. Presentations will take place at the Saddles Plus Interschool Equestrian Festival held on the 20 April 2018 at the State Equestrian Centre.
- Interschool riders must add extra \$15 per horse/rider competition to their entry fee.
- Points from the best placing horse per rider at Capel ODE will be carried onto the 2018 State interschool Championships.
- The top 4 Winning riders in each class (EvA80 to CNC*) may be eligible to represent WA at the 2018 Australian Interschool championships, subject to a selection committee's criteria. Where classes are split due to high number of competitors, 1st placed rider from each may be considered for Australian championships; please refer to the selection policy on Interschool's section of Equestrian Western Australia website.

UNIFORMS- EVENTING CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES

Riders are to wear shirt and tie/stock with school jumper, school vest or school hacking jacket (not school blazer), white or light coloured breeches or jodhpurs and riding boots (full grain gaiters matching boots are permitted). School logo must be worn on either the school jumper, school vest, or school Jacket, along with school logo on saddle cloths.

In the case of hot weather the OC may allow for jumpers and jackets to be removed and shirts underneath must be sleeved. For other attire, refer to EA rules for each discipline.

Interschool Qualifying STATE CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES

Guidelines for Organisers and Riders

As part of our duty of care and risk management responsibilities, Interschool WA requires riders to gain qualifications for Jumping, Dressage, Combined Training, and Eventing prior to entering the WA Interschool State Championships. The aim of competency is that riders demonstrate competency at their height/level in a full competition environment prior to the State Championships. Competing at Interschools is a challenge for horse and rider if they have never been anywhere but their home club or only compete once a year at the WA Interschool State Championships. It also familiarises the rider with current rules and accepted behaviours for their discipline.

Riders at Interschool State Championships are now safer, and have less accidents, because riders are more experienced competitors and proven capable of competing on their horse at their chosen height/level. If riders complete all qualifying at these events the objectives of producing competent, confident competitors are met, and these young riders will cope with the situations they will face as a competitor at the State Interschool Championships.





GENERAL

- All qualifying events must be run by EA affiliated clubs you can check the EWA calendar on the webpage for events that will be counted as qualifiers.
- It is the RIDERS responsibility to ensure qualification performances are judged by an EA accredited judge.
- Riders need to be a either a current Junior Competitive member or Participant member (membership category only requires participant membership for the following levels: Dressage preliminary & novice, Jumping- up to 104cm, Eventing- up to EvA80) leading up to the State Interschool Championships. Competitors **MUST** be a **competitive junior** to compete at the State Interschool Championships and your horse must be registered with EA.
- Athletes and Parents will need to sign an Athlete/Parent/Guardian Agreement & Code of Conduct before inclusion into the State Interschool Championships.
- All qualifying performances must be **recorded on the Interschool Card**.
- Each horse and rider combination must have a separate Interschool Card
- All qualifying events must be ridden by the **same horse/rider combination** that wish to enter the State Interschool Championships.
- The card must be signed by the currently accredited official officiating that class (Judge or Course Designer) in Jumping or Unofficial events.
- The qualifying period for competency is from WA Interschool State Championships from close of entries **9** March 2017 to close of entries for the current year **12 March 2018**. We strongly encourage riders to get their qualifications during the year rather than trying to fit them in before entries close.
- We encourage all riders to understand the **EA Rules** for the discipline they are competing in. Knowledge of the rules is your responsibility.
- Please request Judges to sign your card after your class is complete, before they go home. The Judge may not be willing to sign your card if they no longer have access to the scoresheets. If at an EA Affiliated event your card does not need to be signed only write your results down.
- Where possible include a copy of tests and results attached to your card.
- Club officials (Event Secretary, President etc.) may sign cards.

Submitting Results

All qualification documentation must be submitted to the EWA Office (<u>sarabotten@equestrianwa.org.au</u>)no later than the deadlines below:

DUE DATES

Eventing: <u>6 March 2018</u> Dressage, Combined Training, Jumping, Working Hunter: <u>12 March 2018</u>

Exemptions

A horse and rider combination may apply for exemption from qualification requirements if they can demonstrate extenuating circumstances preventing them from achieving necessary qualifying performances outlined in this document. This includes applications for new horse and rider combinations.

Such a request must be accompanied by the reasons for the request and a detailed performance record. Exemptions MUST be received prior to **12 March 2018** to be eligible for consideration. Applications beyond this date will be rejected.

JUMPING (INCLUDING COMBINED TRAINING AND WORKING HUNTER)

Horse and rider combinations entering classes at WA Interschool State Championships involving jumping **(including combined training and working hunter)** must obtain **TWO** qualifying results at the highest height they wish to enter.





Officials sign the card to certify that the horse and rider combination has completed the course with **less than 12 penalties at fences** in the first round. The Interschool Card must be signed by the **currently accredited EA Jumping Judge or Course Designer** officiating at the competition. The Judge or Course Designer who signs the card must be a currently accredited EA Judge or Course Designer and be officiating for that round. Competitors may get signed off at any competition listed on the Equestrian WA website. Club officials (Event Secretary etc.) MAY sign off on your results.

If a club allows combinations to do a second round in the same class, at any height, riders must be aware of EA National Jumping Rules regarding non-competitive (hors concours) rounds. A second round in the same class on the same horse would be non-competitive, and any round after that for the day would also be non-competitive (eg 60cm Am7 – competitive, 60cm Am7 – non-comp, 75CM Am7 can ONLY be non-comp). Qualifying rounds must be competitive rounds – **training and non competitive rounds may NOT be used.**

Riders who completed jumping rounds at the previous year's WA Interschool State Championships may fill in the card stating the highest height they competed at and do not have to have the card signed by a Judge/Course Designer as we will check through previous results. **Riders still need to obtain a second qualifying result.**

ONE qualifying result may be obtained an EA Eventing competition or PCAWA Eventing Competition conducted by an EA Affiliated club.

A Judge, at their discretion, may decide that a rider did not display competency at the height and may refuse to sign their Interschool Card. The Judge must write to the WA Interschool Committee naming the rider and horse and stating their reasons for this action. This action should only be taken if the judge considers that there are **severe** safety concerns for the competitor, horse, or by-standers should this combination compete at State Interschool Championships.

Jumping Qualifier Check List

For qualifying a jumping round must:

- Be at a competition run by an Equestrian WA affiliated club
- Have a currently accredited EA Judge or Course Designer officiating
- Be a competitive round in a competition (not a training round / hors concours / non-competitive)

FRA

- Have 12 faults or less in the first round
- Be on the horse listed on the card





DRESSAGE (INCLUDING COMBINED TRAINING)

Horse and rider combinations entering classes involving Dressage (including Combined Training) must complete **TWO** tests at **the highest level** they wish to enter at WA Interschool State Championship classes. If you wish to enter the Preliminary 1.2 and the Novice 2.3 you need to ride **TWO** Novice tests.

All riders entering participant and non-official classes must have this card signed by the current EA judge officiating the class to certify that the horse/rider combination has completed the test with a score of at over **55.00%**. All official dressage results will be sourced from the office and do not require a judges signature but your results must be written on your card. A copy of your tests can be attached with your card.

Training and non-competitive tests may **NOT** be used.

ONE qualifying result may be obtained an EA Eventing competition.

Dressage Qualifier Check List

For qualifying dressage test must:

- Be at a competition run by an Equestrian WA affiliated club
- Have a currently accredited EA Judge officiating
- Be a competitive test in a competition be completed with a score of 55% or above
- Be on the horse listed on the card

COMBINED TRAINING

SHOW HORSE

No qualification is required to compete in Show Horse classes at the 2018 State Interschool Championships.





WORKING HUNTER

See Jumping Qualification Guidelines. Qualifying performances above the working hunter class height will be accepted.

EVENTING

Horse and rider combinations entering EVENTING must have achieved **ONE MER (minimum eligibility requirement) at the entered grade** as per the EA Sport Rules at the time of the competition WA Interschool State Championship classes.

All riders entering participant and non-official classes must have this card signed by the current EA Official at the event to certify that the horse/rider combination has achieved an MER. All official eventing results will be sourced from the office and do not require a judges signature but your results must be written on your card.

Eventing Qualifier Check List

For qualifying eventing performance:

- Be at a competition run by an Equestrian WA affiliated club
- Have a currently accredited EA Judge or Course Designer officiating
- Be a competitive round in a competition (not a training round / hors concours / non-competitive)
- Meet the MER requirements as per the Sport Rules at the time of the competition
- Be on the horse listed on the card

<u>Competing in the State Interschool Championship in Eventing will mean athletes will be ineligible</u> to enter Combined Training for the State Interschool Championships
