## **EWA Jumping Novice Series**

## **AIM**

It is envisaged that the series will act as a beneficial preparation for both horses and riders transitioning into official competitions competing at a height of 1.05m.

### **OBJECTIVE**

To administer, along with jump clubs, up to 10 rounds of the series to be run between March and November each calendar year.

### **EVENT GUIDELINES**

- An annual series of shows hosting Novice Series events will run throughout the calendar year in WA; set by EWAJC
- Expressions of interest to become a host club of the Novice Series should be directed to the EWAJC prior to September of the previous year. This can be done in writing directly to the committee or via the EWA dates submission form.
- The Novice Series class is to be run as an open class under article 238.2.2
- The height of the Novice Series classes will run at 1.05m.
- The Novice Series class will be open to horses with 6 points or less at the start of the Show.

# **CLASS ENTRY AND PRIZEMONEY**

- There is to be minimum cash prize money of \$500 per class
- Vouchers or merchandise may be given in addition to the cash prize money total but may not supplement the cash prize money total as above.
- The EWAJC offers financial assistance to each participating host club to help run the qualifier as per the conditions laid out by the EWAJC

#### CONDITIONS FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

In order to be eligible for financial assistance the host club must adhere to the guidelines as said above and the following conditions:

- The EWAJC offers sponsorship of \$350 to each participating host club for the purpose of cash prizemoney
- The host Club is required to sign a Sponsorship Agreement with EWAJC prior to the event program being published or by 31 March each calendar year whichever comes first.
- Host Clubs are to seek the remaining \$150, if not more, amount of additional sponsorship/cash prize money
- Programs must be submitted to EWA Jumping a minimum of four (4) weeks prior to the event-of 7 days prior to publishing.
- The host club is asked to recognise the support from EWA Jumping in the programme stating that the class is part of the EWA Jumping Novice Series by including the follow clause in their program: This EWA Jumping Novice Series round is proudly sponsored by the EWA Jumping Committee riders levy funding initiative.
- If a rug is awarded for the class the host club is asked to recognise the support from EWA Jumping with the following statement printed on the rug: sponsored by EWAJ Rider Levies
- If not all placings are filled and therefore not all granted prizemoney is not rewarded and acquitted; the following amount will be deducted from the grant amount:

Prizemoney awarded	% Grant to be returned
Placings to 4 <sup>th</sup>	49
Placings to 3 <sup>rd</sup>	109
Placings to 2 <sup>nd</sup>	175
Placings to 1 <sup>st</sup>	255

- The Host Clubs running Novice Series classes are required to acquit levies and submit the grant report to the EWAJC within eight (8) four (4) weeks after the event. (template can be found on the EWA website)
- Monies will be paid when the EWAJC is satisfied that the host club has met all of the funding conditions
- A host club may not run another EWA Jumping Series until all jumping rider levies are paid from the previous EWA Jumping series show hosted. If jumping rider levies are not paid by the end of the calendar year then the host club may not be eligible to apply to run an EWA Jumping series the following year; until the levies are paid.
