

How old are you?




How do you identify?




Which region in Western Australia do you live?




Are you are a current member?





Highlighted in the results, the most important membership benefit EWA offer is the 24/7 insurance component tailored to the sport, closely followed by being able to attend and compete at competitions/shows/events.

Others explained Official and Coaching opportunities, High Performance pathway options, supporting the SEC and the use of its facilities, engagement and updates presented in the weekly newsletter, access to free education seminars.

Are there any benefits that EWA does not currently provide that you would like introduced?


Review of criteria opening up High Performance pathways for more members, access to visiting coaches, offer a one day membership, more benefits through partnerships (ie. retail discounts), better access to education seminars for regional members, increase variety of merchandise and online shop tool, increased discounts for events, cheaper access to SEC facilities for regional members/clubs, provide a coaches directory, increase support of club development, funding for rural judges, incorporate all insurances into one flat fee.



How would you rate EWA for its quality of communications to members?




What are your preferred channel/s for receiving communications from EWA?




- Provide an environment that is welcoming, supportive and non judgmental ie. increase rider comradery
- Active promotion of the Sport Local, Regional, State, National
- Reduce State Equestrian facility cost to members ie. reduce hire costs, ground fees etc.
- Provide better structure to membership look to offer more for adult riders and offer inclusion for grass root members
- Increase inclusion for the sport of Vaulting
- Review and promote ruling around Helper Duties at events, clinics and club days all riders are responsible for their own ie. no paid helpers
- Reduce competition fees and levies
- Reduce pressure and offer support to officials. Streamline avenues and provide easier access to become and official and management streams
- Keep Equestrian WA the 'face' of equestrian sport in WA
- Keep the sport more affordable for all involved
- Create growth avenue in all strategic pillars
- Upgrade to facility ie. surface upgrades, drainage, increase/better surface/arena's for jumping
- Support financially for State Teams ie. travel, uniform, event costs etc.
- Develop and implement an Reconciliation Action Plan
- Have regional courses and not just a Perth facility
- Offer and promote training, coaching and judging opportunities aligned with Equestrian Australia
- Offer affordable clinics/masterclasses with State, National and International Coaches
- Increase weekday events and opportunities














In 2022, how many times did you visit the SEC?




Approx. 7% of participants did not visit the SEC in 2022.






