1. DISCIPLINE TEAM SCORING

Champion School and Reserve Champion School are awarded for each discipline (dressage, eventing, combined training, show jumping and show horse). Composite Teams are eligible for Discipline School awards only.

For each discipline the school team comprises of four riders the top 3 (or three if only three riders are eligible) highest scoring riders in that discipline. The points of the **three** highest scoring team members based on the championship results are totalled to give the team score. The score of the 4th team member (if there is one) is used to resolve ties. The team with the highest total is awarded 1st place (Champion School) and the team with the next highest total is awarded 2nd place (Reserve Champion School). Composite teams are eligible for Discipline Awards.

Due to low entry numbers in the Primary classes, Championship and Participation divisions were combined for the Discipline awards, and composite teams were included in the Primary division. Where there were insufficient riders in a discipline, only a Champion Team/School will be awarded.

Secondary Dressage:

The top 3 results highest scoring riders for School ABC. Only the highest point is taken forward for the team awards (points highlighted)

The school team score is 84 (27 + 30 + 27). A team may consist of 3 or 4 riders.

Equality in points will be resolved for the Champion School and the Reserve Champion School awards. The school whose 4th rider has the higher total score will be ranked higher. If equality still remains the class placing's of the individual team members will be considered (for example a school score of 102 (28+28+26+20) will be ranked higher than a school score of 102 (28+27+26+21). If equality still remains, the level of competition will be considered, with scores from higher-level competition ranked higher than equivalent scores from lower-level competition.

If a rider has ridden two horses in a discipline, only the rider/horse combination with the highest score will be considered when determining the school team score ie a rider can only be in a team on one horse.

3. OVERALL SCHOOL TEAM AND OVERALL COUNTRY TEAM SCORING

Championship Points obtained (across all disciplines) by each school member are totalled. The school team comprises the four highest scoring riders. The points of the **three** highest scoring team members are totalled to give the school score. The score of the 4th team member (if there is one) is used to resolve ties. The school with the highest total is awarded Overall Champion School, and the school with the next highest school will be awarded Overall Reserve Champion School. A school that Composite teams are not eligible for Overall School Awards.

Equality in points will be resolved for the Champion School and the Reserve Champion School awards. The school whose 4th rider has the higher total score will be ranked higher. If equality still remains, the class placing's of the individual team members will be considered (for example a school score of 102 (28+28+26+20) will be ranked higher than a school score of 102 (28+27+26+21). If equality still remains, the level of competition will be considered, with scores from higher-level competition ranked higher than equivalent scores from lower level competition.

If a rider has ridden two horses, only the rider/horse combination with the highest score will be considered when determining the school team score a rider can only be in a school team on one horse. School GHZ would be awarded overall school.

If a school is awarded the Overall Champion School and is also the highest-placed Rural School, it will not be eligible for the Rural School award. Instead, the next highest-placed Rural School will receive the Overall Rural School award. However, a Rural Team may be awarded both the Reserve Overall and Champion Rural School titles.

4. OVERALL CHAMPION RIDER AND OVERALL RURAL RIDER SCORING

Points for overall Riders are taken from the championship placings. The riders top three scores across all disciplines are used to give the overall champions.

If a rider has ridden two horses, only the rider/horse combination with the highest score is eligible for rider awards.

Equality in points will be resolved by a count back where the number of wins will be taken into consideration. If equality still remains, the level of competition will be considered, with scores from higher-level competition ranked higher than equivalent scores from lower-level competition.

If a Rider is awarded overall Primary or Secondary Rider and is also the highest placed Rural Rider, they cannot be awarded the Rural Rider Award. The next placed rider will be awarded the Rural Rider.

5. HIGHEST PLACED INDIVIDUALS PARTICIPANT AWARDS

Points for overall Riders are taken from the championship placings. The riders top three scores across all disciplines are used to give the overall champions.

The rider/horse combination with the highest total score is awarded Participant Rider/Year Group Champion Riders.

If a rider has ridden two horses, only the rider/horse combination with the highest score is eligible for rider awards.

6. OFF THE TRACK HIGH POINT AWARDS

Horse's must have a Horse Passport to be considered for the OTT Awards.

Points will be awarded in Dressage, Jumping, Eventing, Combined Training and Show Horse.

For example -Dressage OTT horse

The points based on placing's for each phase are added together. The rider with the highest total is awarded 1^{st} place, the rider with the next highest total is awarded 2^{nd} place, the rider with the next highest total is awarded 3^{rd} place and so on. Class points will be allocated using the weighting, 1^{st} = 30 points, 2^{nd} = 29 points, 3^{rd} = 28 points, and so on. All places from 29^{th} onwards will be awarded 1 point.

Where there is equality of placings each discipline rules will be applied.

• Combined Training/Eventing – the rider/horse combination with the lowest penalties will be placed higher.

- Show Horse The rider with the best result in phase 3 Ridden:
- Show jumping The rider with the best result in phase 3 and
- Dressage the rider with the highest average percentage received at the highest level ridden.
- Eventing The rider with highest aggregate score.

Points obtained (across all disciplines) by each rider/horse combination are totalled. The rider/horse combination with the highest 2 scores are combined is awarded Overall Champion OTT horse, the horse with the next highest 2 scores combined is awarded Overall Reserve Champion OTT horse.

6. **DISCIPLINE AWARDS**

Eventing

The 2024 Saddles Plus Interschools Eventing Champion Combination will be determined by which combination attended, and who scored the most points across all three events. Points will be allocated across the whole event placings per height, including those who have not nominated for the series. There will only be one (1) Champion presented across all heights. Primary and Secondary riders will not be separated for this award.

Show Horse

The 2024 Interschool's Show Horse Champion Combination will be determined by who gains the most points possible in their overall scores. In the case of a draw, the combination who received the most points in the Rider Phase will win. If a draw still occurs, the combination which received the most points in the Ridden Phase will win. Primary and Secondary riders will not be separated for this award.

Jumping

The 2024 Interschool's Jumping Champion Combination will be determined by the combination with the highest accumulated points across a Championship regardless of the Championship height but with at least a clear round in the AM5. If there is still an equality – as per rule 10.6.2 (Interschool National Rules) the rider with the higher ranking in the 2 Phase shall be placed highest. Where riders still have equal points, the rider in the higher level is awarded the trophy. Primary and Secondary riders will not be separated for this award.


Dressage

The 2024 Duncan Equine Group Interschool's Dressage Champion Combination is presented to the combination with the highest accumulated points across a championship regardless of the Championship level. Class champions with a minimum two scores higher than 64% across both tests will be considered for this award. Where combinations have equal points the rider in the higher level is awarded the trophy. If a draw still occurs, the combination with the highest aggregate score will be determined the winner. Primary and Secondary riders will not be separated for this award.

Vaulting

The Interschool Champion Vaulter is presented to the highest scoring vaulter within their individual class, across all vaulting classes. All first-place winners across individual Interschool vaulting classes

are considered. In the case where vaulters receive equal individual scores, the vaulter competing in a higher-level class will receive the award. With vaulting both Participant and Competitor members are eligible.
