Cross Country Course

The Course is situated on the plains of the Swan River, and includes both permanent and transportable type fences. There is a water complex and good open grassed country for galloping. The EvA95, EvA80 and EvA65 courses are very encouraging for young or inexperienced horse and rider combinations. Our Entry fees are unchanged, however, we have had to pass on the SEC Facilities Fee to our riders.

ENTRIES

Please note – unpaid entries at closing will NOT be placed in the Draw.

Classes may close early if full. Late class changes and Direct Deposits incur an additional \$20 handling charge and depend on spots being available in the class.

When entering on KTRIALS please enter the **Emergency Contact Person** and phone number of the person who will be with you at the Event.

Interschool Competitors - EvA80 – CCN2* Brigadoon CNC is pleased to host the 2019 State Interschool Eventing Championships. Open to current EA Members who are secondary students (Year 7 up to and inc Year 12. Further Information on Interschool Classes is attached at the end of this Document. Riders tick the Interschools Nomination box on your Ktrials entry, there is a \$15 fee for Interschool Championship Riders. Please note at this event you will ride in your School Uniform.

NEW Classes – Adult Rider and Participant classes are open to Adult Rider and Participant members of the EA only. Adult Riders may ride in their Adult Rider uniform. Competitive members must ride in the Open classes (even if they belong to an Adult Riding Club). Rugs will be awarded but other prizes for these classes may be vouchers.

HELPERS

All competitors must nominate a helper 16 years of age or over OR pay a \$70 helper fee. These fees are used to pay the SEC to set up and dismantle the dressage arenas.

Self help is available to riders with one horse. Self help is NOT available to riders of more than one horse, unless completed prior to the event or if two horses are in the EvA65 and 80 classes. Self-helpers will be normally be allocated to XCJJ team. Competitors may attend a Busy Bee prior to the event or assist with set up, course flagging etc. depending on requirements, helper spots for these jobs are limited.

Helpers should be prepared for up to a 4 hour helper duty either Sat or Sun. Special requests will be filled if the Duty is available, please make a note on Entry. XCJJ get maximum flexibility to work around ride times. Other duties the time is fixed.

Brigadoon CNC still only asks for one helper per rider, not per horse, but Helpers of Riders with multiple horses may get an extended duty of help.

Helpers selecting "As Arranged" must enter the arranged duty in Comment box

Paid database helpers must be entered on KTrials with a "DB" helper name and phone number

The organising committee must be notified of a change of helper, experience is required for some duties.

Busy Bee date: Sun 19th May 2019, XC Setup is during week prior to Event.

PROVISIONAL TIMETABLE

Saturday – Dressage and EvA65 and some EvA80 Show Jumping. All dressage in 60x20m arenas on SEC main field or in the International Arena, Details will be on the Draw. All new EA dressage tests can be found on the EA webpage www.wa.equestrian.org.au/eventing/eventing-dressage-tests

For this event the Showjumping is on the CQuest arena. Warmup also in the CQuest arena.

Sunday - Cross Country (all grades) usually 65 and 80cm in morning with presentations lunchtime & remaining Show Jumping. Please note that **BIKES** are not allowed on the cross-country course on Sunday.

STARTING TIMES (and Helper Duties) will be available on the KTrials website approximately one week before the Event.

WITHDRAWALS and SCRATCHINGS

The secretary must be notified of withdrawals prior to the event. Withdrawals prior to the Event closing on KTrials will receive a full refund less an Admin fee. As per EA refund policy, entry fees for scratchings received after close are not refunded. However, a partial refund will be given depending on the amount of notice given and whether the helper duty is completed. *Please note you are obliged to notify the Organising Committee (OC) of your intent to withdraw. It is requested that you do so as soon as possible.*

PRIZES

As recommended by EA. Rugs and prizes subject to sponsors. Placegetters are required to write and thank the sponsors of their class. Details are in the voucher/prizemoney envelopes.

ACCOMMODATION

Camping at SEC and Swan Valley Pony Club grounds is permitted and is free to EA members. Note new SEC rules – no power available, bring generators and cables must not be run across roadways. A speed limit of 20kph applies across the SEC.

STABLING / YARDS

Many yards available at PC grounds, please leave clean and free of hay and manure. There are 350 permanent yards available around the polocrosse fields, first come – first served. Stables can be booked at the State Equestrian Centre – book online. No camping or exercising horses on the Polocrosse competition fields.

REFRESHMENTS

Various food vans will be present. Please note the SEC is a licensed venue, no alcohol to be brought on site.

HELMET STANDARDS – As per EA rules, Riders will be required to confirm their helmet meets one of the following standards:

Protective headgear must conform with one of the current approved safety standards:

- *Current Australian standard AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards) provided they are SAI Global marked.*
- *New Australian standard ARB HS 2012 provided they are SAI Global marked.*
- *Current American standard ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards) provided they are SEI marked.*
- *Current American standard SNELL E2001.*
- *Current British standard PAS 015 (1998 or 2011) provided they are BSI Kitemarked.*
- *Interim European Standard VG1 (01.040: 2014-12) with or without BSI Kitemark.*

SADDLES PLUS STATE INTERSCHOOL EQUESTRIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

EVENTING COMPETITOR INFORMATION

This competition will be held at Brigadoon CCN-S on the 25 – 26 May 2019

- Riders must be current financial Equestrian Australia members & membership number must be included with entry together with name of school & school year
- All Interschools State Championship riders need to hold a valid EA competitive junior membership and have their horse registered & microchipped for this event
- Interschool Championship competitors are to wear shirt and tie/stock with school jumper, school vest or school hacking jacket (not school blazer), white or light coloured breeches or jodhpurs and riding boots (full grain gaiters matching boots are permitted). School logo must be worn on either the school jumper, school vest, or school Jacket, along with school logo on saddle cloths. In the case of hot weather the OC may allow for jumpers and jackets to be removed and shirts underneath must be sleeved. For other attire, refer to EA rules for Eventing.
- Interschool riders may have multiple rides in different classes (One Interschool horse per class) but only the best placing result will count towards Interschool points.
- Competitors can compete as an Interschool competitor from EvA80 level through to the CNC*. (EvA65 level is not an Interschool Championship class or qualifier for Australian championships).
- Interschool riders ride within their chosen class, so if Interschool rider "A" in the Junior EvA95 class finishes 3rd in the class, but is the highest placed Interschool rider they will receive the 3rd place prize from Brigadoon CCN-S as well as 1st place prize from Interschool WA.
- Interschool ribbons will be awarded to the 1st – 6th (Points will be awarded as per 2019 Interschool's schedule), however there will be no presentations made at Brigadoon for Interschool riders. Presentations including for overall awards will take place at Interschool WA State Championships Awards Evening held on the 6 July 2019 at the State Equestrian Centre.
- Interschool riders must add extra \$15 per horse/rider competition to their entry fee.

Selection of State Team for Australian Interschool Championship

To be eligible to for selection on the WA State Team at the Australian Interschool Championships athletes must compete in qualification classes at the WA State Interschool Championship as marked in the schedule. These are **compulsory** for the horse and rider to be considered selection on the WA Team at the Australian Championships to be held NSW in 2019. Performances in the EWA Junior Leaderboard, EWA Official Competitions and Australian Interschool Championships will be considered but performances at the WA State Interschool Championship Qualification classes is compulsory to be eligible for selection.

Selection applications will open following the Saddles Plus State Interschool Championships. At the Australian Championships athletes will be limited to competing in 2 classes, they may still compete on 2 horses, but the limitation of 2 classes per athlete will remain. **Applications close 31 May 2019**. Qualification - Eventing

Horse/Rider combination must achieve ONE qualification performance at an Eventing Competition run by EA Affiliated Eventing Competition officiated by current EA Officials within the qualification period.

QUALIFICATION PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS:

A qualification performance is achieved by completing a competition within minimum parameters of all round performance as follows:

- a) Dressage Test: not more than **42 (58%)** penalty points.
- b) Cross Country Test: — 0 penalties at obstacles
— not more than 75 seconds exceeding the optimum time in the Cross Country Test.
- c) Jumping Test: not more than **12 penalties** at obstacles.

Horse/Rider combination competing in Eventing Championship Classes are **ineligible to enter Combined Training Championship Classes at the Interschool Equestrian Festival** in the same year.
