The successful coach must be experienced and confident in both Jumping and Dressage, with the ability to provide quality coaching and support across both disciplines throughout the competition.

Coach Responsibilities

- Work closely with the State Team Manager to support the safety, preparation and warm-up of competitors, generally from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm each day.
- Provide strategic and practical coaching tailored to each rider's skills, strengths and personal goals.
- Support full participation by team members and actively contribute to team cohesion.
- Promote positive, respectful and constructive communication between riders, team personnel and event officials.
- Follow the direction of the State Team Manager and provide regular updates as required.

What We're Looking For

- Current EA accreditation, preferably Level 2 or above, although other suitably accredited coaches will be considered.
- A supportive, empathetic and positive approach, with strong communication and people skills.
- The ability to work collaboratively, maintain confidentiality and support team decisions.
- Willingness to comply with all relevant EA and EWA policies, procedures and Codes of Conduct.
- Ability to follow team management directives and work effectively as part of a broader team.
- Current Working with Children Check.
- Current Senior First Aid qualification.
- Willingness to work hard, including managing early mornings and late evenings while travelling with the team.
- An enthusiastic attitude and commitment to the Spirit of the WA State Team.

- Availability to travel and stay with the team for the duration of the Australian Championships.

Remuneration & Expenses

EWA will cover the coach's travel and accommodation costs, including airfare, as well as provide a daily allowance for meals (up to \$70 per day) for the duration of their engagement.

Selection Process

All Expressions of Interest will be reviewed by the WA State Team Manager and Equestrian WA selection panel. Shortlisted candidates may be contacted for an informal discussion prior to a final decision. All applicants will be notified of the outcome.
