Equestrian interest:	I have ridden and competed Dressage for some 35 years. I have competed to official advanced level. I also show jump having jumped to 1.20m in the past.
Previous Board / Committee experience:	I set up and was the chairperson for Hills Sports Riding club, where we ran very successful dressage competitions for several years. I was also the chair of Dressage WA some 17 years back and was heavily involved in running the State Championships back then. I was also in an advisory role on the EWA Board for a year or so due to my business background.
Reason / objectives for interest in representing EWA on the Dressage WA Committee:	I believe strongly in the future if WA Dressage and I feel that the sport has many opportunities to be even better in WA including the governance of the committee and how it interacts with its members. There is a large dressage community in WA and I would love to see our state asset being used for more competitions and events. The committee has an opportunity to reshape and move forward to deliver better value and outcomes for our members.
