

### *What is a Series Class*

The Jumping WA Committee (JWA) Series Classes are classes that have been sponsored by JWA (major sponsor) utilising the JWA rider levies paid by riders at EWA affiliated shows. These classes have specific guidelines in the interest of the sport.

When you place in a JWA Series class, points are allocated to placegetters, and these accrue over the year.

At the conclusion of the year, the horse and rider combination with the highest points for each Series Class is awarded the Series High Point Award.  
Leader board places are awarded to 6<sup>th</sup> place.

### *The Classes*

JWA sponsors 7 series classes.

JWA administers 2 OTTWA series classes.

Horse and Rider combinations may only compete in one series class per show. Eg Youth combinations cannot enter the Bronze as well. Riders may compete in multiple classes on different horses. Riders may compete in OTTWA classes as well as a JWA sponsored series class

If a horse and rider combination attain points in multiple series throughout the year, their position will be determined by the higher place, and they will not be eligible for a prize in the lower placed leaderboard. However, if a combination wins two or more leaderboards, the higher class leaderboard will take priority and they will be ineligible to win in the lower leaderboards.

### Aim:

The Bronze Series is a great way to take the next step in your show jumping journey. This class is a stepping stone for riders who aim to compete in the JWA Silver Series classes.

### Conditions:

- The Bronze Series is to be run under article 220.2.1.2
- Horse and rider combinations competing in the JWA Bronze Series class may NOT COMPETE in any other Series class at the same show.

### Aim:

The Gold Series is beneficial preparation for both horses and riders transitioning from Bronze to Gold series classes.

JWA will include an award for the highest placed youth rider (12-21years) across the seven Silver Series fixtures, with the overall winner to be recognised at the end-of-season awards celebration event.

### Conditions:

- The Silver series is to be run as an open class under article 220.2.1.2
- The Silver Series class is **not to be run as the last class of the day.**
- Horse and rider combinations competing in the JWA Silver Series class may NOT COMPETE in any other Series class at the same show.
- A rosette for the highest placed Youth (12-21) is to be awarded at each fixture.

**Aim:**

The Gold Series is beneficial preparation for both horses and riders transitioning from competing at a height of 1.20m and progressing through to heights of 1.30m plus. It is also a class to help riders wanting to compete in the JWA HOTY Series class.

**Conditions:**

- The Gold series is to be run as an open class under article 220.2.1.2
- The Gold Series class is **not to be run as the last class of the day.**
- Horse and rider combinations competing in the JWA Gold Series class may NOT COMPETE in any other Series class at the same show.

**Aim:**

The HOTY Series Class is great preparation for both horses and riders who are aiming to compete at Grand Prix level, WA State Senior Championships, National Senior Championships and at World Cup level.

**Conditions:**

- The HOTY Class is to be run as an open class under article 220.2.1.2 or 221.3.3.1
- The HOTY series is considered to be the most prestigious in Western Australia. Clubs are asked to make sure that the classes are placed appropriately in the program, preferably between noon and 2pm, to highlight the nature of the class. **It is not to be the last class of the day.**
- Horse and rider combinations competing in the JWA HOTY Series class may NOT COMPETE in any other Series class.

**Aim:**

The Youth Rider Series is beneficial for Youth Riders wishing to prepare for open series classes.

**Conditions:**

- The Youth Rider Series class is to be run as an open class under article 220.2.1.2
- A Youth Rider is a rider between the age of 12 and 21. Riders can take part in the Youth Series from the calendar year they turn 12 until the end of the calendar year, in which they reach the age of 21 years.

**Aim:**

The Grass Roots Series is a great opportunity for Junior riders to compete in a Series that is targeted for riders of the same level. The height of the Grass Roots Series class will be at 80cm.

**Conditions:**

- The Grass roots class is to be run as an age class under article 220.2.1.2
- The Grass Roots Series class is available to riders until the 31<sup>st</sup> of December the year they turn 18.
- Horse and rider combinations in this class may not compete in any other series classes.

**Aim:**

The Foundation Series is a great opportunity for Senior riders to compete in a Series that is targeted for riders of the same level. The height of the Foundation Series class will be at 100cm.

**Conditions:**

- The Foundation class is to be run as an age class under article 220.2.1.2
- The Foundation Series class is available to riders the calendar year they turn 19yrs and over.
- Horse and rider combinations in this class may not compete in any other series classes.

The OTTWA 80cm Series is a great opportunity for OTTWA riders to compete in a Series that is targeted for riders of the same level and breed. The height of the OTTWA Series class will be at 80cm.

**Conditions:**

- The OTTWA class is to be run as an open class under article 220.2.1.2
- Horse and rider combinations in this class **may** compete in any other series class

**OTTWA 110cm series**

Min Cash Prize Money: To be determined by the club in line with OTTWA sponsorship

Entry Fee: \$20

Class Type: **Open**

Height: **110cm**

**Aim:**

The OTTWA 110cm Series is a great opportunity for OTTWA riders to compete in a Series that is targeted for riders of the same level and breed. The height of the OTTWA Series class will be at 110cm.

**Conditions:**

- The OTTWA class is to be run as an open class under article 220.2.1.2
- Horse and rider combinations in this class **MAY** compete in any other series class

***Series Jump Heights***

The below is a table of heights that the Series Classes **must be run at** throughout the year. This is a starting height for the classes to be run at. Heights may vary depending on surface and increase throughout the year.

## Prize Money and Entry Fees

### Total Cash Prize Money and Entry Fees

The below table of the **minimum** cash prize amounts that must be awarded for series classes. Additional prizes in cash or kind may be **added** to these amounts. In-kind prizes may not be used to make up the required total 'cash prize' amount, they must be **additional** to these amounts.

### Prize Money Breakdown

The below table sets out the cash component prize money breakdown that should be awarded. The last place getter should always receive their entry fee back:

**Clubs are to award to 6<sup>th</sup> place.**

## ***Points and Leader Boards***

The Leader Board will be managed and updated by JWA. Once Clubs have submitted their acquittals, the Leader Board will be updated and published on the JWA Facebook page.

Where a rider accrues a total of 16 penalties or more in the first-round the rider will not accrue leader board points.

The winner of the leader board will be announced after all acquittals have been received and will be awarded prizes at the annual JWA Awards night.

### **Leader Board Points Allocation**

JWA Series Class points will be allocated as follows, regardless of event location or number of competitors per Series Class:

| <b>Place</b> | <b>Points</b> |
|--------------|---------------|
| 1st          | 12            |
| 2nd          | 10            |
| 3rd          | 8             |
| 4th          | 6             |
| 5th          | 4             |
| 6th          | 2             |

As of the 1<sup>st</sup> of January 2026 **a competitor's top 5 results will count towards their leader board total**. This is similar to how the World Cup League is scored in Australia. This system means that riders can choose to rest their horses for a show and not be disadvantaged.

## ***Clubs and Event Organisers***

Clubs are welcome to obtain additional sponsors for the Series classes. However, the sponsorship obligations must be adhered to.

### **Sponsorship Obligations**

- As of 2026, a rug is required to be presented to the winner of the series class. JWA will contribute a sum of \$50 per rug.
- Jumping WA is the (main) sponsor and must be named first on all programs and entry forms clearly stating Jumping WA <Series Class>.
- Jumping WA is the (main) sponsor and must be named first on any prizes, rugs & signage.
- The Series Classes must be advertised on the Clubs social media pages, programmes and signage.
- If clubs are advertising in the EWA newsletter, it must be highlighted there will be JWA Series Classes being held.
- **If a club has a cash sponsor that is interested in sponsoring a Series Class, they can sponsor the club's portion and to a higher value if they wish to.**
- **Vouchers or merchandise may be given in addition to the cash prize money total but may not supplement the cash prize money total as above.**

### **Sponsorship process**

- An application form is required to be submitted to the Jumping Committee. Applications can be submitted to [jwacommitteeall@groups.outlook.com](mailto:jwacommitteeall@groups.outlook.com) or you can complete the online form [here](#).
- A copy of the proposed program must be sent to JWA, showing all the classes, heights, entry fees being charged and prize money, two weeks prior to advertising/opening entries.
- If the program does not meet the requirements laid out above your sponsorship will be denied, and an email notice will be sent to you. You will be given the opportunity to resubmit your program with amendments to the JWA Committee for approval.
- If your program meets the requirements and your event has been deemed suitable to run JWA Series Classes you will receive an emailed Notice of Acceptance and, subject to providing your acquittal, sponsorship will be paid.
- Acquittals, levies, and results must be either emailed to JWA or the online form completed within 14 days from the date of your event in order to receive your sponsorship funds. Failure to provide this information by the due date will result in forfeiture of sponsorship. Please complete your acquittal [here](#).

- Should Clubs fail to submit their acquittal by the required deadline and sponsorship is revoked, points will still be awarded to Series Classes, however these results will be taken from the Official Judges Results Sheets submitted to EWA.
